






DEATH SETS SAIL


ROBIN STEVENS

leader is found dead in her cabin, stabbed during the night.






PALACE WALK

NAGUIB MAHFOUZ

The Palace Walk is the first in The Cairo Trilogy by the Egyptian novelist and Nobel Prize winner Naguib Mahfouz. The action begins in World War I and follows the lives of al-Sayyid Ahmad Abd al-Jawad and his family.

Written in a social realist style, Mahfouz details the family patriarch's behaviour and its impact on his immediate family. While he sets strict rules of Muslim piety and sobriety in the household, he permits himself officially forbidden pleasures.

Intertwining stories from private history and public records, Soueif tells the story of the Egyptian Revolution of 2011. Like thousands of others, she called Tahrir Square home for 18 days reporting events to the world media and doing whatever she could to help.







ALAA AL ASWANY

Taha, the doorman's son, has both career and romantic aspirations beyond the Yacoubian that are dashed due to corruption. His entwined story unfolds with devastating consequences.

Iris shares her fading memories of a lost lover in World War II, which come to shape the future in unexpected and dangerous ways. The interwoven past and present draw Iris and Ruby closer than they could have imagined.

Barber's classic novel is a gripping family saga set against the backdrop of the not-so-distant rumblings of World War II and nationalist forces in Cairo. As the children of diplomats, Serena Pasha and Mark Holt have grown up in a magical world of champagne breakfasts and midnight picnics at the pyramids.




THE AUTOMOBILE CLUB OF EGYPT




